
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FEBRUARY AND MARCH NEWSLETTER

Knowledge What do we want our children to know?

Play is at the heart of inquiry learning in the PYP. The children spend time engaging in different activities learning new skills and coming to new understandings. But what should children be learning? What is important for children at our school to know about?

At PIPS we ensure that our units are authentic, meaning they are relevant to children of a young age and something they already have some knowledge about. We provide hands on learning opportunities so that the children learn by doing. This enables them to fully engage in the classroom.

Although learning at PIPS follows the interests of the children, the teachers plan each unit thoroughly ensuring that each of the traditional subject areas (maths, language, social studies, the arts, personal, social and physical development and science) is embedded into daily play activities so that children are developing and mastering basic skills such as counting, sorting, colour recognition, letter and sound knowledge, social skills, writing and well beyond. This ensures that our approach is balanced and children are having constant exposure to new skills and experiences. We carefully select the units that make up our Programme of Inquiry and review them each year to ensure they are significant, relevant, challenging and engaging for our students.
