<u>Learner's Agency in the Early Years at PIPS</u> By Indira Gurung

We had our first PYP Parent Workshop for all our parents in November and thank you for making time for us! It was an amazing experience, and we are always happy to share how the children learn at PIPS. We will plan for more Parent Workshops in Term 2, so stay tuned!

Reflecting on the workshop, one of the areas we would like to highlight is the Learner's Agency. As an IB World School, we aim to develop skills and concepts that children can use in their daily lives and prepare them for whatever their future may hold. Whilst our teachers and parents work hard to provide a plethora of learning engagements and experiences in school and at home, children form their own understanding and build on their pre-existing knowledge.

With this ongoing development of skills and concepts, we believe the best way for our children to experience authentic learning is by giving our children the voice, choice and ownership of their own learning. As teachers, we strive to listen to our children's voices, value their opinions and thoughts, providing them with learning experiences that they can relate to and extend their learning. We give children the choice of where they want to explore and what they want to learn in the classroom. We give ownership by encouraging children to be responsible for their own learning and taking care of their own things, classroom and people around them.

This all leads to children using their self-efficacy and becoming agentic learners.



AGENCY SUCCESS CRITERIA

This poster by thinkchat explains learners' agency in the early years. Our community can share and talk to our children about what it means to be agentic learners.

'The concept of agency has significance in the early years because children form their self-concept as soon as they begin to interact with others. This occurs in a wide range of environments, in particular their home environment. Learners bring that self-concept with them to the school learning environment, and it evolves further as they begin to interact with adults and peers there.'
