Effective Parental Involvement by Ms Indira

The children at Parkview International Pre-School (PIPS) are blessed to have parents who are committed to and involved in their learning and education.

Effective parental involvement is about balance. It, ideally, encompasses all the elements of childhood development. It is not just about ensuring our children are competitive academically and developing cognitive and language abilities. It is equally crucial for us to ensure that our children develop competently in their physical, emotional, social, and problem-solving skills.

At PIPS, we believe in play-based learning through inquiry. We believe in celebrating children's natural curiosity, because the best type of learning is when the children are interested in learning. We also believe in developing children as whole persons. What underpins learning is helping children develop a healthy sense of self and an understanding of how they fit into the communities in which they live. This healthy sense of self and community can only be formed when the children feel secure and know how to relate to others through empathy and social conscience – skills we often call “soft skills”.

Think back on your personal experience. When were you most effective in your workplace? When were you most effective in learning when you were a student? When did you feel most positive when faced with challenges? One would suggest that work and learning seemed much easier to manage when you were physically healthy, emotionally secure, and enjoyed real and caring relationships with those around you. Challenges seemed smaller, because one was better able to solve problems and see things from different perspectives.

At PIPS, we want to work in partnership with our parents, not only in the pursuit of our children's knowledge, but also in the development and equipping of valuable skills so that they grow up to become internationally minded, effective and contributing members of society. We hope to celebrate and support our children's learning journeys, milestones and achievements, and to make school life an enjoyable and significant experience for both parents and children.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

School Hours

For our preschoolers, the main door will be opened at 8:25am for the morning session and 12:25pm in the afternoon. Please do not send your children to school too early. Dismissal time will be 11:30am for the morning session, 3:30pm for the afternoon session. Please try to encourage your child to be on time when coming to school. Punctuality is an important lesson for us to learn in life! A punctual start also conveys to the child that school is important and is valued by you.

Extra Curricular Activities

Our school offers a wide range of extracurricular activities on weekdays and Saturdays. Applications for classes starting at the beginning of September are now open. Please collect a leaflet from our front office. All applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis, so please apply as soon as possible to guarantee your place!

Typhoon and Rainstorm Arrangement

The weather in Hong Kong can be quite unpredictable. In case of bad weather conditions such as typhoons and rainstorm warnings in force, please refer to our weather policy in the Parent Handbook and check for announcements from the Education Bureau or the weather Observatory of Hong Kong.

Student Card

To ensure the security and safety of your child, parents or guardians must present the student card before picking up their child from school. In the absence of this, the parent or guardian will be required to show his or her ID card and sign a collection form from the office.

Car Park

For those who drive your child to school, please park your car in the car park next to the supermarket and bring your child to the classroom. Please do not park your car at the front entrance as the parking space is reserved for our school buses. Please remember to bring your parking ticket and we can stamp it for reimbursement. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Clothing

We recommend that children wear their PIPS uniform except on special occasions. Our uniform allows your child to feel a part of the school while also expressing their personality and preferences through choice of colour. Accidents can happen so please keep a spare set of clothes in your child's school bag. Shoes should be comfortable and safe, with an elastic or velcro strap to help your child to develop their independence. Please mark all clothing, bags, hats and shoes with your child's name to avoid any mix-ups.



IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Safety & Hygiene

Kindly record your child's temperature on the temperature booklet. Children are also required to take temperature upon arrival at school in the Reception area. Please do not send your child to school if they are ill. If your child develops any symptoms at school, parents will be notified and they will be asked to be sent home. All children will be required to wear a face mask according to EDB requirements.

Daily RAT Testing

As mandated by the EDB, school staff and children are required to take a RAT test every school day before coming to school until further notice. In the new school year, please continue to take a picture of your child's RAT test kit and record your child's RAT test result on the Temperature Record booklet. Though parents are no longer required to send this picture to the class teachers prior to the start of the school day.

Updated Information

Please let our teachers know about any changes in your routine at home as these can dramatically affect children's behaviour and wellbeing. By letting us know, we will be able to help your child to deal with situations such as a new sibling, a short or lengthy absence of a parent, moving to a new home, the illness or death of a family member, friend or pet, etc. This information will be considered privileged and will remain strictly confidential.

Please notify our school office if you have a change of address, phone number, email address, new helper, or authorised pick-up person. It is important for us to have current information to best serve your child. We also need to be advised of changes to the ones you listed as emergency contacts on your registration form.

Seesaw Platform

Every week your child's teachers share observations, images/clips of your child's progress in the class on the online platform, Seesaw, which is our primary means of communication with parents.

Seesaw is a widely used, user-friendly online learning platform which helps teachers to record, track and celebrate children's progress in their learning journey. Important reminders about the class and school will also be shared on the platform. You can also leave notes to our teachers and they will respond to your message during their preparation time. **For any urgent messages, i.e., late pick-up, please call the school instead.**

Our teachers have already sent messages inviting parents to the platform. Should you have difficulty getting connected, please let us know.

Once set up, you will be able to access these pictures at any time and be able to download them or forward them to relatives. We kindly request that you are sensitive about group pictures and do not upload these to any social media sites. Thank you.

Open Day - 24th September (Saturday)

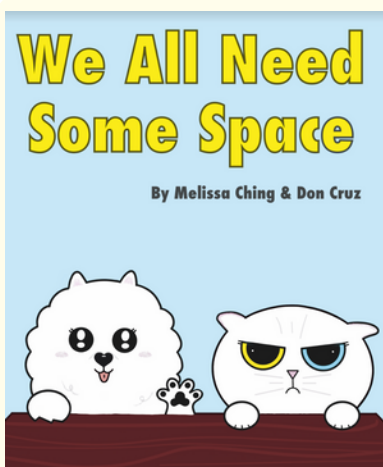
We will be hosting our Open Day on 24th September for both campuses. If you have friends who would like to know more about PIPS, please tell them about the event. Thank you.
