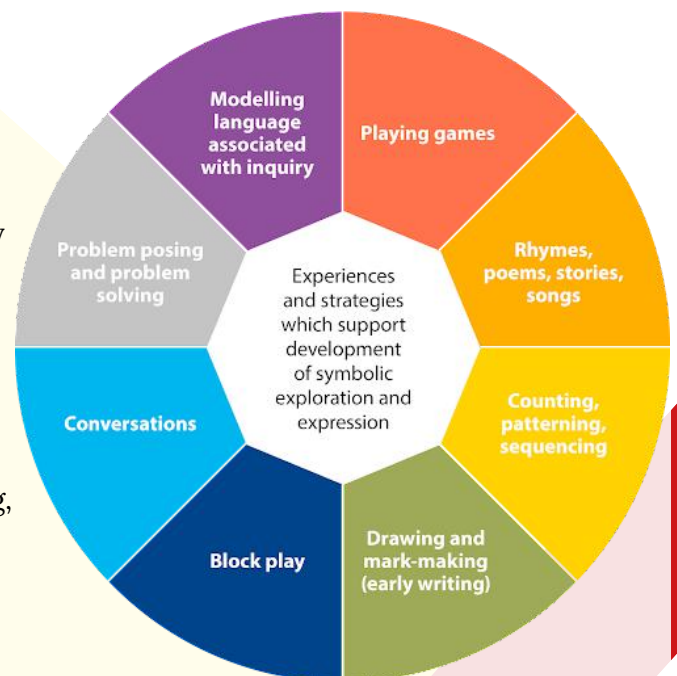
Supporting Symbolic Exploration and Expression at PIPS by Ms Indira

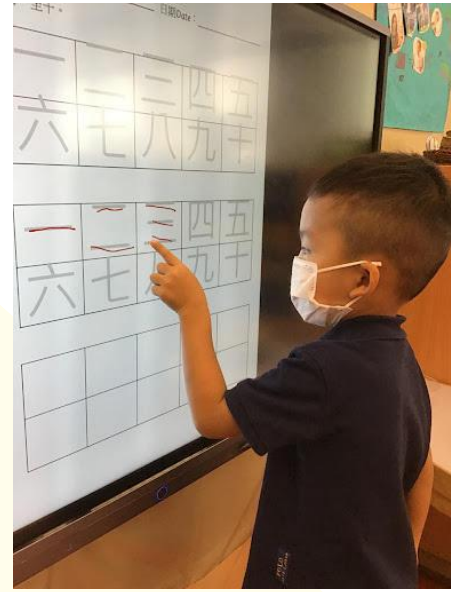
Symbolic exploration and expression are present in all our PIPS classrooms, from art experiences, play provocations, to reading and writing. It is how we explore various ways to communicate our ideas, thoughts and feelings. At PIPS, we believe that symbolic exploration and expression are the basis for the development of literacy and numeracy skills. Enabling children to express themselves more effectively and more eloquently as they progress through their early years. Our play-based inquiry approach explores authentic reading and writing, and makes it meaningful and purposeful for our early learners.

'Learning through play offers young students opportunities to engage with language and mathematical concepts, knowledge and skills that arise naturally from their worlds. Building upon learners' play, educators can show learners the different ways of representing meaning.' IBO, Early Learners, August, 2022

Our teachers plan and deliver learning engagements with intentional emphasis on symbolic exploration and expression with authentic opportunities to make meaning, for example, with everyday experiences such as:

- Self-registration, where children select their name badges or select their name and put it in a slot provided. The older children have opportunities to trace or write their names
- Visiting our school library, where children can choose books to read and return them to the correct boxes by matching the number or letter
- Counting the number of classmates present with the teachers
- Creating posters, signs and art related to unit
- Finding books or images to pursue an inquiry that arises through play
- Providing opportunities for independent mark-making, writing and creating art
- Opportunities for reading in each classroom with an inviting reading area
- Engaging learners in discussions about their play
- Reading stories, singing songs and rhymes in Chinese and English
- Older children have regular guided reading time in Chinese and English
- Regular 'Show and Tell' opportunities where children develop their ability and confidence to present in front of a group





Our phonics program is based on Letters and Sounds, Phases 1 to 3, a phonics program created by the Department of Education and Skills, UK. As for our Chinese character recognition and writing, we have developed a school-based program tailored to the children at PIPS.
