

Our technology and assessment focus...

How have our assessment practices changed?

This year one of our targets was to develop the way we do assessment in school. We began the year reviewing our assessment practices and thinking about what we currently do and what we could improve on. We then had our 'Assessment in the Early Years' workshop from the IB which engaged the teachers in discussions around the purpose of assessment and how it might look in the early years. As a result we now use a wider range of assessment strategies that are reflected in our assessment policy. As a school we know that all children are different and learn at different paces and in different ways, so we have developed our assessments to be more flexible to allow children the opportunity to succeed.



How do we use technology at PIPS?

We have also had a focus on technology this year too, discussing opportunities to incorporate it within our units of inquiry. As part of the PYP programme, children develop a range of trans-disciplinary skills such as thinking skills and research skills and technology really lends itself well as a tool to support this. Our teachers had some in-school training led by Mr. Don with various gadgets and discussed what learning would look like in their respective year levels. PIPS has a great provision for technology which is continuing to grow, and it is always surprising how much the children already know about using it!
