Vigilance against Hand, Foot, Mouth Disease (HFMD) and Enterovirus 71 (EV71) Infection

As advised by the Centre for Health Protection (CHP), we are now entering the peak season for hand, foot and mouth disease (HFMD) and enterovirus 71 (EV 71) infection. Therefore, we would like to urge all staff, parents and children to pay extra attention to their personal hygiene and environmental hygiene of the school, home and public areas.

HFMD is a viral infection commonly seen in children. The infection can occur throughout the year in Hong Kong but the disease activity usually peaks from May to July. Common symptoms include fever, sore throat and skin rash over the hands and feet. Although the illness is self-limiting in most cases, some cases especially those caused by EV71 may be associated with complications like myocarditis, encephalitis or poliomyelitis-like paralysis. Maintaining good hygiene practice is the most important measure to prevent HFMD and EV71 infection.

In order to help prevent the outbreak of disease, please take note of the following measures:

- Make sure that children have a healthy diet, enough sleep, fresh air and rest, and take regular exercise to build up their immune systems in a healthy way.
- Seek medical advice as soon as possible if children develop symptoms of fever, abdominal pain, sore throat and ulcers in

the mouth and throat and spots on the palms of the hands and soles of the feet.

- Children with HFMD should be excluded from schools until fever has subsided and all the vesicles have dried and crusted. As an extra precaution, children with EV 71 infection should not go to school for another two weeks after all symptoms have subsided. A clearance note from your doctor is required when your child returns to school.
- Inform the school immediately if children are sick or have been admitted to hospital for surveillance. Such information and contact details of students may be reported to CHP or relevant government departments on a need to know basis to help the school put into effect control measures to prevent the spread of communicable diseases.
- Co-operate with the school by picking up children not feeling well from school and consulting the doctor immediately.
- Supervise children's personal hygiene practices. Teach them how to wash their hands properly with liquid soap before meals and after going to toilet, and to cover their nose and mouth while sneezing or coughing, and the importance of disposing of used tissues properly.

• Perform a simple screening on your child's health everyday before sending them to school.
